



FY24 First Quarter Overtime Update

Key Takeaways

- Overtime spending is coming in under budget. First quarter overtime spending of \$59.6M was \$8M less than the Target Budget projection of \$67.6M.
- The City spent 22% of its overtime budget in Q1, leaving 78% (\$211M) for the rest of FY24.
- FY24 first quarter overtime spending is \$5M less than in Q1 of FY23.




At \$59.6M, overtime spending in FY24 Q1 represented 14% of Class-100 obligations, down from 15% in FY23 Q1 but up from 12% in FY22 Q1. While the first quarters of both FY22 and FY23 came in over target budget amounts, overtime costs in the first quarter of FY24 were \$8M under the target budget.



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Overtime by Department



These 15 departments are responsible for \$59M, or 99%, of FY24 Q1 overtime spending. Public Property has spent the highest percentage of its overtime allocation (42%) due to an increase in the number of special events in Q1 of FY24 compared to Q1 of FY23. Police and Fire spent the highest dollar amounts on overtime (\$115M and \$77M, respectively) but had the largest decreases in overtime spending compared to Q1 of FY23. While the reduction for Police is attributable to a timing change for abatement processing, the reduction for Fire was possible due to increased uniform strength.
